Nineteen years of professional athletic experience including a successful ten year major league baseball career as well as coaching and instruction of both professional and amateur athletes. Professional Baseball

- Retired after the 1991 season as a result of a degenerative back injury.

- Manager for Schaumburg Flyers Northern League inaugural Season (1999-2001) Won both halves and went to playoffs in first year. Was instrumental in getting 23 players signed to affiliated baseball.
- Hitting Instructor for the Valparaiso University varsity baseball team.(1991-2000)
- Established Kittle's Kages in 1991 to provide individual and small group hitting instruction to players ranging from youth league to college level
- Selected by renowned professional hitting coach Charlie Lau for the cover of his book "The Art Of Hitting" in recognition of his expertise and commitment as a hitting instructor
